Code of Conduct for Students

- 1. Students must report to class on time and to attend all classes on each working day. Random reporting and exit are impertinent and disturbing.
- 2. Students must wear the college identity card when they are reporting to the college for any kind of activity. They must present the same for inspection on requirement.
- 3. Any sort of ragging is not allowed inside the institute campus or anywhere else related to the institute. Anyone found indulged in such activities is liable to be punished as per the directive of the UGC and Govt. Any incident of ragging will be dealt with very seriously. The accused will be punished that may be up to dismissed from the institute and a case will be filed with the local police authorities.
- 4. Any kind of political activities in the campus must be forbidden.
- 5. Students should wear the prescribed uniform on all working days whenever they are involved in the academic activities. Uniform symbolizes unity and uniformity, not diversity. It also indicates equality and a sense of belonging to the institution. It is also a source of pride and responsibility, not liability.
- 6. Parents need to take care of their children to provide uniform and look for their getup while reporting to the institute.
- 7. Silence must be observed strictly in the reference section of the library and in the library.
- 8. Students are expected to spend their free time in the library. They should not loiter along the corridors of the academic section.
- 9. If the academic performance of the student is not satisfactory the student is likely to be detained and will not be allowed to appear for the examinations as per university regulations conducted by the institute on behalf of the University.
- 10. Students must not wait on the institute premises while the classes are going on.
- 11. Talking and other disruptive behaviors are not permitted inside the class.
- 12. Food and beverages are not permitted in computer labs or classrooms.
- 13. Consumption of narcotics inside the institute premises or entering the institute premises, after consuming the same can't be tolerated

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- **15.** Students should address faculty as Sir of Professor, calling faculty by their first names is not appropriate.
- **16.** Students should not indulge themselves in any unfair activities either inside or outside the institute.
- 17. Must be polite and respectful towards others, instructor and other students.
- **18.** Though it is the responsibility of individual faculty and HOD of the department for the arrangement of class in case of any absence, the class student representative should inform the Head of the Department for alternative arrangements.
- **19.** No illegal Society or Association shall be formed at the students' end in the institute and no one will be invited to address a meeting without the HOD's or Principal's prior permission.
- **20.** Collect of any amount or contribution for picnic, trip, and educational visit to someplace, get-together, study-notes, charity or any other activity without the prior permission of the authority will be treated as illegal and punishment will be initiated.
- 21. No student will be allowed to take active part in current politics.
- **22.** For the participation in inter-collegiate events students require prior permission from the concerned person in-charge, committee and Principal.
- **23.** No student shall communicate any information about the institute orally or writing to the press.
- 24. Students are expected to take proper care of institute property and help the institute authorities in keeping the premises clean and discipline. Damaging institute property e.g. disfiguring walls, door fittings or break furniture, misuse of fittings, or breaking furniture, misuse of A.C. etc., is breach of discipline, and the guilty will be duly punished.
- **25.** Students should not leave their books, valuables at places in the institute and if it happens then institute will not be responsible for missing of items. However, the Institute will be responsible for lost property, if it is deposited in the Institute Office.
- 26. Students applying for certificates, testimonials, etc. Which require the Principal's signature or any kind of document or application should first contact the institute office / department. Students should net bring any paper directly in the Principal's office for signature.
- 27. The grant and continuance thereof of financial assistances in terms of Government or



Institute Scholarships are subject to observation of well behavior, regular attendance and satisfactory progress and good results at the Institute and University Examinations.


- 28. All institute activities are organized under the guidance and supervision of the Principal and Professor in-charge.
- 29. Students must not associate themselves with any activity not authorized by the Institute Director. Serious action will be taken of students found organizing or participating in such unauthorized activities.
- 30. Students using unfair means at examinations will not be readmitted in the Institute. Actions will be initialed against such students as per the norms and procedure prescribed by the University.
- 31. Every student has to participate in at least two of the co-curricular activities offered in the institute.
- 32. It is the responsibility of the students to go through the notice boards on daily basis for important announcements made by the Institute office from time to time. They will not be excused or given any concession on grounds of ignorance or not reading notices.
- 33. Disciplinary action will be taken against students found carrying and for using cell phones, pagers, walk mans, Disc mans, i Pods etc. on the institute premises.
- 34. Maters not covered by the existing rules with rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal.
- 35. Limited parking space is provided for students and staff and the same can be utilized on first come first basis. The institute management is not responsible for the safety (including damage and for theft loss of vehicles} of vehicles in the premises.

- Yoga essay and art competitions: sometimes EATM conducts yoga and art completion, where the students get ample opportunity to showcase their excellence in this field as well.





The celebration includes workshops and seminars on topics such as





Programme gets concluded by the vote of thanks given by the cultural convener of the institution. Followed by either a sweet distribution or a lunch.



- Distribution of sweets



- Prasad Distribution: After the puja everybody gets served with delicious Prasad. Which is organised by the cultural committee.



Highlights:



- Prasad Distribution: After the puja everybody gets served with delicious Prasad. Which is organised by the cultural committee.



Celebration of Kargil Vijaya Diwas - 26 July

India celebrates Kargil Vijay Diwas on July 26 every year. It is named after the successful Operation Vijay. India effectively regained control of the high outposts that Pakistan had lost on this date in 1999. Both sides lost soldiers during the more than 60-day-long Kargil conflict, which came to a close on July 26. India regained control over all of the previously held area at the end of the war, thereby reestablishing the status quo ante bellum.

Every year, Kargil Vijay Divas are held to honor the heroes of the Kargil War, remembering the 527 sacrifices made and the countless lives that were at jeopardy. Throughout its illustrious history, Einstein Academy of Technology and Management has consistently remembered to recognize and respect our country's heroes. The bravery, tenacity, and fortitude of our armed personnel were put to the test during the Kargil War. It was fought in bad weather, on perilous terrain, and at high heights. In addition to the adversary, our forces had to battle the harsh terrain and unfathomable odds. Despite harsh weather, oxygen shortages, and challenging terrain, they remained steadfast in their commitment to serving our great country.

Important Facts:

- 1. Initially, Pakistan blamed militants from Kashmir and denied any role in the conflict. However, over time, statements from Pakistan's Chief of Army Pervez Musharraf and Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif revealed their complicity.
- 2. The goal of the incursion was to starve the people of the Siachen Valley and cut off Ladakh from Kashmir in order to pressure India into accepting Pakistan's demands.
- 3. Following the 1961 start of the first Operation Vijay, Goa, the Anjediva islands, and Daman and Diu were taken over. In 1999, the second Operation Vijay got underway.
- 4. On July 26, 1999, the Kargil War came to a close following an unusually protracted conflict. It was a historic day in the history of Kargil Vijay Diwas as Indian army drove Pakistani invaders out of their occupied positions.


